Curriculum:

We are a comprehensive four-year public high school utilizing a block schedule with 8 classes total. Grades are reported quarterly, with a traditional unweighted GPA of 0-4.0 **The average composite ACT score is a 21.**

Advanced Placement Courses:

English language, English literature, Spanish language, 2-D & 3-D studio art, chemistry, physics 1, human geography, world history, U.S. history, calculus AB, statistics, and U.S. government. 467 students took an AP test in the spring, and 640 tests were given, with an overall pass rate of 68%.

Honors Options: We offer honors courses in English, math, and chemistry.

Industry Certifications: In partnership with MTEC, we offer state certification in EMT, electrical, nursing, medical and dental assisting, and pharmacy technician.

We have over 215 students immersed in the business world at our Center for Advanced Professional Studies (CAPS) campus. Students work in business, agriculture & environment, medicine & health, engineering & industrial design, digital media, and innovation. There were **333 career pathways completed** in last year's senior class.
