Wasatch County is a rapidly growing county in Utah, with a strong history in agriculture and a growing year-round resort community. Wasatch High School is the only high school in the district, serving nearly 2,700 students in grades 9-12.

Curriculum:

We are a comprehensive four-year public high school utilizing a block schedule with 8 classes total. Grades are reported quarterly, with a traditional unweighted GPA of 0-4.0. The average composite ACT score is a 21.

Advanced Placement

We offer 17 AP courses, including English language, English literature, Spanish language, 2-D & 3-D studio art, chemistry, physics 1, human geography, world history, U.S. history, calculus AB and BC, statistics, and AP psychology, and U.S. government.

599 exams tests were given, with an overall pass rate of 74%

Honors Options: We offer 6 honors/pre-AP courses in English and math.

College Credits: We offer over 50 concurrent enrollment college credit courses including general education certificates and associate's degrees. 42% of our students participated in this program.

Students earned 9,459 college credits last school year.

Professional Studies (CAPS)

We currently have 213 students immersed in the business world at our Center for Advanced Professional Studies (CAPS) campus. Students work in business, agriculture & environment, medicine & health, engineering & industrial design, digital media, teaching as a profession, and innovation.

\$99,750 in scholarship money was awarded to seniors in CAPS.

There were **246 career pathways completed** in last year's senior class.

The Wasatch Education Foundation raised funds to disburse \$528,550 to WHS seniors only.

4 WHS seniors won the prestigious Sterling Scholar Award.

1 student earned a perfect score of 36 on the ACT.

Dual Immersion Language:

We have a Spanish language program with 252 students enrolled in AP Spanish and level 3000 college courses.

120 students earned the Seal of Biliteracy, in Spanish, Portuguese, French, American Sign Language, and German.

Athletic accomplishments:

- 8 student athletes were admitted to colleges on scholarship
- Girl's wrestling took 1st place at state
- Boys' volleyball took 2nd in state
- Boys' soccer took 2nd in state
