Human Sexuality Curriculum Review	Wasatch County School District Nurse, Aubreigh Parks and Health Teachers	 All Human Sexuality programs are OPT IN Curriculum taught in grades 5, 7 and 9 Grade 5 is one hour, nurse led, on maturation, consent, body safety Grade 7 is one-two days, health teacher instruction, more anatomy and physiology Grade 9 is three days, nurse-led and health teacher supported, STDs, abstinence-based, contraception, healthy relationships, etc. Instruction does not cover gender identity, arousal or value standards Question/Answer sessions are a part of all sessions Very few students choose not to opt in; students have been very respectful; students are encouraged to talk to their parents about what they have learned
Questions/Discussion/ Summary	• Parent discovered gender identity and arousal information in links on WCSD website WCSD was unaware. The link is to a website, Always, that WCSD has referenced for the information booklets that they provide. The original booklet did not include the gender and arousal information, but has been updated by the publisher. WCSD will either create a permanent link to the older version of the booklet, or drop the link altogether.
