It is essential to balance fiscal responsibility with the commitment to providing a strong education. I believe in working transparently with the community to

make sure every dollar is used effectively and in a way that reflects the district's priorities. Maintaining open communication with the community about budget decisions can build trust and ensure that all voices are considered when making difficult decisions.
